#### **Canadian Government Continues Debate Regarding Canada Post**

*June 24, 2011*

Legislation was introduced this past Monday to end the Canada Post dispute and force Canadian postal employees back to work. Renewed negotiations between Canada Post and the CUPW came to a standstill Wednesday evening, compelling the government to move ahead with the legislation. Opposition parties are demanding changes to the bill which must then be passed by the Senate. This resistance is delaying passage of the bill and caused an all-night parliamentary debate last night which may continue into the weekend. Canada Post has indicated that, if needed, the Canadian Government has agreed to work through the weekend in order to bring this legislation to a vote. The opposition could reportedly delay the resumption of postal services to next Tuesday or Wednesday.

Brokers Worldwide will continue to accept and process Canada-bound mail and will hold the mail securely until the situation in Canada is resolved.
