International Shipping Simplified
Quick, Easy, Convenient, Goes International

In [today's Federal Register](#) we published for comment our proposal to simplify our international shipping options and make it easier for you to use our products for your international shipping needs. The changes align our international products with our well-known and trusted domestic products – Express Mail, Priority Mail, and First-Class Mail. The *Federal Register* notice is intended to provide you with the opportunity to comment on and make suggestions regarding the proposed changes. You have 30 days to make comments.

The following table illustrates the international product simplifications:

Global Express Mail	Express Mail International
Global Priority Mail Airmail Parcel Post Economy Parcel Post	Priority Mail International

In addition to the product changes, we are restructuring international mail prices. The international changes would become effective when we change our domestic prices in May 2007.
